FROM THE HEAD'S CHAIR

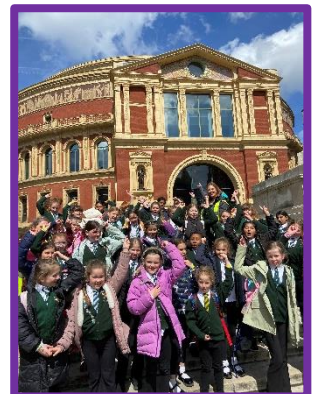


ROYAL ALBERT HALL

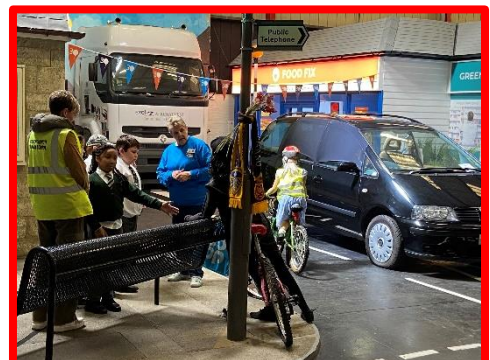

IMPORTANT MESSAGES

ABSENCE APP	<p>You can now report your child's absence daily via Parentmail, by 8.40am please. Parentmail will make the process much quicker and easier for the office team, enabling us to check the whereabouts of all children more efficiently. Please use the absence tab on the left-hand side of your Parentmail dashboard to report to the office if they are off school for any reason. Many thanks.</p>	
PARKING PROMISE	<p>The area outside our school is busy in the morning and at the end of the school day. Parents who park close to entrances act irresponsibly, potentially placing our children and their families in danger. Parking on yellow zig-zag lines is not only illegal but can also pose significant safety risks. Violating this rule may result in fines, which can vary depending on the specific location. Look out for a Parents Parking Promise letter next week.</p>	
PACKED LUNCHES	<p>Please can you ensure that packed lunches are sent into school with your child in the morning. We are having an increasing number of parents dropping in lunches during the school day and whilst this might be an occasional need, it is something we want to reduce. Many thanks.</p>	
PE KIT DAYS	<p>During swimming season this term, your child might come home in their PE kit on PPA days if they have had a PE lesson. Not changing at the end of the session will increase the learning time that the children have – we will endeavour to ensure all their uniform comes home with them!</p>	
BOOK FAIR	<p>Next week the Book Fair will be open in the school hall after school every day. Please come with your child to have a look, thumb through a few titles and see if there are any titles that excite you!</p>
