**tch**

This spelling can be used when the /ch/ sound is in the middle or at the end of a word and when the sound comes after a short vowel.

**catch**    **kitchen**



**tch** is part of the /ch/ sound family:

<b>ch</b>	<b>tch</b>
<b>bench</b>	<b>witch</b>
<b>chick</b>	<b>hatch</b>
<b>perch</b>	<b>fetch</b>
