FROM THE HEAD'S CHAIR





As I am sure you are all aware, one of our Y6 children was sadly involved in a car accident at the end of the day last Friday as he was crossing the road at the traffic lights between Tesco and the cemetery. The emergency services were called and arrived quickly, gave first aid and took him to the John

On behalf of Lewis' family

On the 15th September whilst on his walk home from school Lewis was tragically hit by a car. As a result Lewis is in a coma and remains stable however critical. The family are unsure yet as to how long Lewis is likely to remain in hospital for. They would never ask for any financial help, though as a community so many of us want to help as best we can. The money raised will be to support the family with whatever they need during such a difficult time. If you are able to make any contribution however big or small it would be greatly appreciated.



Ratcliffe hospital where he has remained in a serious but stable condition since. Lewis is beginning to show positive signs and through regular contact with his family, I know there will potentially be a long recovery ahead. The response from the community has been incredible and a 'GoFundMe' page has been set up to support him and his family. The generosity of the community has resulted in £4800 being raised already which is heart-warming and I know the family are incredibly grateful.

Sharing the news of Lewis' accident has been a shock to everyone at school, teachers and children alike. It has been a very emotional time and I know the thoughts and prayers of the whole school community are with Lewis and his family and we are all hoping that he will get well soon. His classmates have made him cards and sent messages, which I know he'll enjoy reading when he is a little bit better.

Since the accident on Friday, I have had numerous phone-calls and messages at school reporting our

children for continuing to cross the road in an unsafe way. I have called four families this week alone. Furthermore, there continues to be a small minority of parents who park inconsiderately, putting other road users at direct risk. Whilst I appreciate that the school run is a busy time, I would ask everyone, again, to think about their own behaviour and that of their children. Whilst we continue to think about Lewis and his family, we will of course be building in practical road safety sessions with all of our children over the coming weeks and months, to ensure we are doing everything we can to keep them safe. If you would like to pass on a message to Lewis and his family, we are happy to coordinate these and

The biggest thing you can all do to help is to think about your own journeys to and from school and take a moment to discuss it with your families. Teach your children how to cross the road safely, how to use the crossings, how to look both ways, how to listen for cars (electric cars are very quiet these days) and how to take it seriously. A phone call from me to say your child has been involved in an accident such as this is the last thing that anyone wants.

I'd like to send my personal thanks to Adam from Club Sport who was on the scene almost immediately and acted swiftly and professionally. Thank you to the members of the community who stayed to support the emergency services and the family at the time. Thank you to the emergency services who rallied around Lewis swiftly to make sure he was in the best possible hands. Finally thank you to the staff and children at STOKENCHURCH who have been exceptional at supporting each other at the difficult time. We of course wish Lewis the very best of luck as he recovers in hospital and will remain in contact with the family so we can check in on how he is doing and hopefully keep his friends and teachers up to date.
