WHAT WE' VE DONE THIS TERM	 SDP updated A one-page summary for stakeholders published on the school website for end of Autumn term We have introduced a new 'Comms checklist' to all staff to ensure communications in and out of school are consistent and timely New AV system installed in the school hall New school website is compliant and launched in December 2023 All teacher appraisals are complete and LSA appraisals are planned for Term 3 A new 'Circle Model of Governance' has been adopted by the governing body We received 170 responses to our parent questionnaire and key messages are being shared and an action plan created to address development points 	 The school has invested in a new scheme to support the development of the curriculum in most non-core subjects We have reviewed and updated our school vision and values and are beginning to share these widely Training in the new curriculum has been delivered and curriculum maps and skills progression documents are in the process of being updated New assessments have been sourced to better match the curriculum 90% parents believe that the teaching is of a high standard at STOKENCHURCH Twinkl phonics is becoming embedded 'Reading Fluency' sessions happen daily Y2-Y6 Our maths curriculum day was a great success 4 teachers have started the second year of the maths mastery training 	 Absence is monitored regularly and challenged through our attendance policy, including fines where necessary A wide range of activities and approaches have supported the children's feeling of safety, including Hazard Alley workshops Y5/6, PCSO engagement, Bikeability sessions for F2, NSPCC assemblies, Young-carers assembly, internet safety, etc. Parent survey suggests 92% children feel safe at school Our behaviour policy has been updated to include report cards for the few children who need them We have engaged with Optimus to develop our school approach to wellbeing and completed a staff wellbeing survey Detailed H&S plans are being actioned 2 additional DSLs have been trained and safeguarding remains a high priority for everyone 	 Our school council have helped to choose and launch our new houses - FIRE, EARTH, AIR and WATER We have appointed JRSOs in line with our school travel plan Digital leaders have been appointed Eco representatives have been elected for each class Our school assembly rota has been updated and recognises different faiths, cultures, events and occasions throughout the year ELSA sessions are running with children who need them- more staff to be trained in the Spring term Charity ventures have been successful and children know the importance of 'giving back' Community events involving the children have been well attended with STOKENCHURCH being well represented and appreciated in the community 	 Curriculum planning ensures that this is in place in F1; still developing in F2 30-hour provision and Nursery lunch club are now in place and growing EYFS advisor visit welcomed We have had a Stay & Play, phonics workshop, Stay & Sing, Parents Evening / Art Gallery and Open Day this term Baseline completed for F2 children Significantly improved and being accessed regularly by the children who need it when they need it Skills ladders are now in place from F1-F2 with specific key vocabulary for each text and area of continuous provision Curricular goals are now planned and beginning to be used more in planning Audit complete and will be renewed on a rolling basis from term to term as new texts are introduced
