<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We are concentrating on our numbers to 20. Our White Rose scheme concentrates on maths mastery. Children learn about numbers to 20 in many different ways. Simply counting to 20 and back is not enough. At home investigate the numbers from 11 to 20. Can children count on and back from any given number? For example, if they are given the number 14 can they instantly recall 15 as being the next number or the number 13 as being the previous number? We will also be working on addition and subtraction within 20. You could use household objects to make number stories. Barry has 12 teddies and he gets 3 more for his birthday. How many teddies does Barry have now?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>English</u></p> <p>We have been learning about different poems. Please spend time sharing your favourite poems together. Can you spot any rhymes? Do all poems have to rhyme? Can you remember a short poem and recite it? In class we have been learning Spike Milligan's poem 'My Sister Laura.' What is your favourite poem?</p>
