## Top Tip

The vowels $a, e, i, 0$ and $u$ can make both their letter sound or name in words. The letter sound is short while the letter name makes a long sound, for example:
$\because$ a makes the long sound Mail (acorn, bacon)
$\dddot{e}$ makes the long sound leel (we, be)
i makes the long sound light (kind, wild)
$\because$ makes the long sound loal (gold, hotel)
ii makes the long sound lyool (uniform, unicorn)
Sometimes you might read a word with a short vowel sound but it doesn't make sense. You can then try reading it with a long vowel sound.
